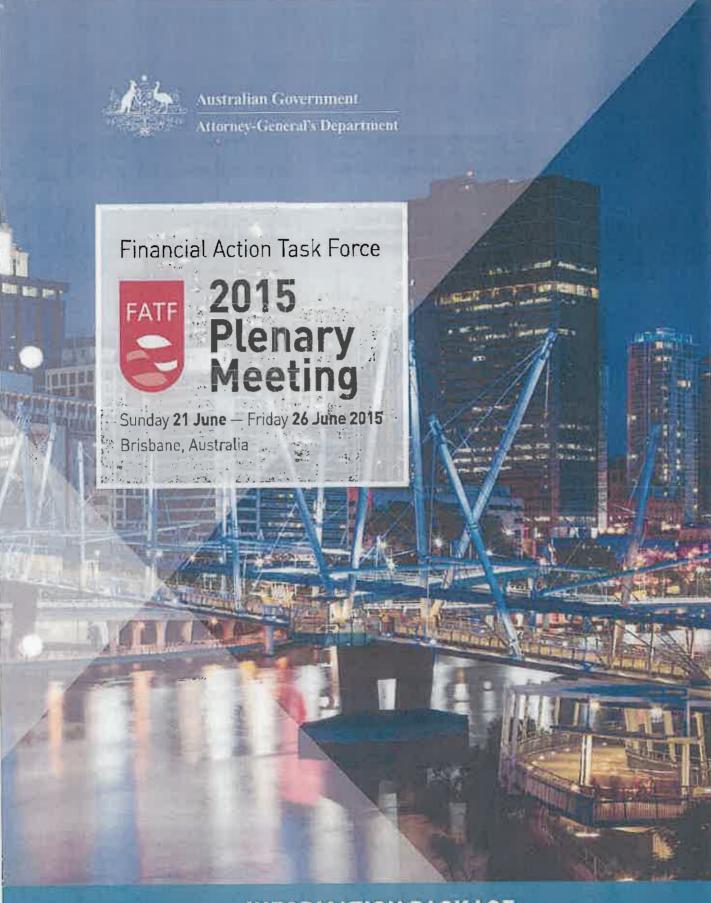

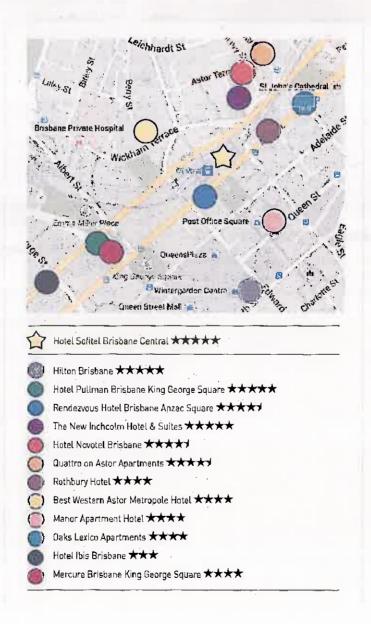

AGD will not share, disclose or sell personal information to any other third parties without the consent of the individual.

TRAVELLING TO AUSTRALIA

Visa requirements

All FATF delegates must hold a valid visa to travel to and enter Australia. Delegates should first register for attendance at the meeting and then follow the appropriate link below to the Department of Immigration and Border Protection website for further information and to identify the relevant and correct visa application process. Delegates are encouraged to apply for visas as early as possible, as some visa types may take up to 4 weeks to process.

The following visa types are available for delegates:

- eVisitor (Subclass 651): available to passport holders from the European Union and a number of other European countries. Applications can be made at: www.immi.gov.au/e_visa/evisitor.htm
- Electronic Travel Authority (ETA) (Subclass 601): available to passport holders from countries including Canada, Japan, South Korea and the United States. Applications can be made at: www.immi.gov.au/visas/visitor/601.aspx
- Visitor visa (Subclass 600): available to passport holders who are not eligible to apply for an eVisitor or ETA. Delegates applying for this visa should request a letter of invitation from the FATF on their registration form. Applications can be downloaded from:

Aviation security screening

All delegates travelling on regular commercial airline services, both international and domestic, are required to submit themselves and their carry-on baggage for security screening.

The screening of passengers and carry-on baggage is a process designed to detect weapons and prohibited items and prevent their entry into sterile areas at security controlled airports and on board aircraft operating as screened air services.

In addition to passenger screening, aviation security regulations require checked baggage to be screened. This process, whereby checked baggage is x-rayed, occurs behind the scenes and should not impact upon passengers in most circumstances.

Enhanced security measures to limit the amount of liquids, aerosols and gels that can be taken through the screening point for travellers to and from Australia are in effect in all Australian international and domestic airports. Customs

For visitors to Australia, most personal items such as clothing, footwear and articles for personal hygiene and grooming may be brought into Australia in accompanied baggage free from duty and tax.

For other goods, limits apply, and you must declare them on arrival into Australia. These include goods that are purchased overseas and goods that are purchased in Australia duty or tax free [that have been previously exported] or from an inwards duty free shop on arrival into Australia.

A limited quantity of alcoholic beverages [wine and/or spirits not exceeding 2.25 litres] and tobacco products (50 cigarettes or 50 grams of cigars or tobacco products) are allowed duty and tax free entry into Australia for personal use. In addition, up to \$900.00 AUD worth of general goods [gifts, souvenirs, electronic equipment, leather goods, perfume concentrates, jewellery and sporting equipment] can be brought in duty and tax free.

Please be aware that if you exceed Australia's duty-free concession limits you will be charged duty and tax on all items of that type (alcohol, tobacco or general goods), not just the items which exceed the limits.

Quarantine

Australia has very strict quarantine laws.
All delegates must declare items of quarantine concern on their Incoming Passenger Card and be ready to present these items for inspection if required.

Items that must be declared on arrival into Australia include

- meat, poultry, fish, seafood, eggs, dairy, fruit and vegetables
- weoden articles, plants, parts of plants, traditional medicines or herbs, seeds, bulbs, straw and nuts
- animals and animal products including equipment, eggs, biologicals, specimens, birds, fish, insects, shells, bee products and pet food, and
- soil or items with soil attached including
 sporting equipment, shoes, etc

Yellow Fever

Travellers to Australia must declare if they have been in Africa, South/Central America or the Caribbean in the past six days. Furthermore, travellers who have visited or reside in a yellow fever region are asked to provide a valid Yellow Fever Certificate. More information can be found at www.health.gov.au/yellowfever#12

Ebola Virus Disease (EVD)

The Australian Government has introduced a 'travel history card' which all incoming passengers must complete and hand to Customs and Border Protection officers on arrival in Australia, along with the existing incoming passenger card. This card will require you to make a declaration if you have been in an EVD-affected country within the last 21 days. Transport

Brisbane International Airport is the closest airport to the city of Brisbarie. All delegates will need to arrange their own transport between the airport and the Sofitel Brisbane Central or alternative accommodation option. Brisbane airport is located approximately 14 km north-east of the Brisbane Central Business District (CBD).

A list of taxi companies and rental car services can be found on page 12. Taxi stands are located at both the domestic and international terminals at Brisbane airport. A taxi ride from the airport to the Brisbane CBD will cost approximately \$30.00-\$40.00 AUD.

Alternatively, Brishane's Airtrain runs from 05.00 to 22.00 daily from both international and domestic terminals to the city. The journey takes approximately 25 minutes, and the Sofitel is located directly above Central Station. An exclusive offer of only \$27.00 return from Brishane Airport into Brishane City, or \$15.30 one way to the city has been negotiated for FATF delegates. Please note that in Australia, it is compulsory to wear seat belts in all vehicles. In addition, smoking is not permitted in rental cars and in private cars where children aged 16 and under are present.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Brisbane

Located a mere 16,500 kilometres from the FATF's home base in Paris, Brisbane is a modern metropolitan city, centred on the winding Brisbane River. Home to nearly two million culturally-diverse residents, it boasts an extensive sporting calendar, as well as a range of cultural precincts made up of theatres, museums, and contemporary Australian as well as international cuisine.

International Dialing codes

The country code for Australia is 61. The area code for Brisbane is 07.

For calls to Brisbane from overseas, use the appropriate international access number + 61 + 7 + local number.

To make an international phone call from Australia, dial the appropriate international access number + country code + phone number.

Drinking water

Brisbane tap water is safe for consumption.

Electricity supply

The power supply in Australia is 220-240V, 50HZ. A step down transformer is needed to convert the current to 110-120V. Australian plug adaptors have two flat prongs in an inverted "V" shape, and some also have an earth connector. Delegates are advised to bring their own electrical adaptors.

Currency, banking, credit cards and ATMs

The currency in Australia is the Australian dollar (AUD). It comprises 5, 10, 20 and 50 cent and one and two dollar coins; and notes of 5, 10, 20, 50 and 100 dollar denominations. Current exchange rates are as listed by the Reserve Bank of Australia.

Banking hours are generally:

- Monday to Thursday 09 30 to 16 00
- Friday 09 00 to 17,00

Selected banks in Brisbane also operate on weekends. The largest banks in Brisbane are National Australia Bank, Suncorp Bank. Commonwealth Bank, Bank of Queensland and Bendigo Bank. Brisbane also has international banks including Citigroup and HSBC.

Automatic teller machines (ATMs) are located throughout Brisbane's CBD and major credit and debit cards are widely accepted. Most internationally recognised currencies and travellers cheques can be exchanged at commercial banks, bureaux de change and at Brisbane airport.

Postal services

The nearest post office to the Sofitel Brisbane Central is located at 300 Adelaide Street and is open from 09 00 to 17-00 on weekdays.

Driving

Visitors to Brisbane are allowed to drive on their overseas licence as long as it remains current and they have not been disqualified from driving in Australia or elsewhere. The overseas driver's licence must be carried when driving. If the licence is not in English, an English translation or an International Driving Permit must also be carried.

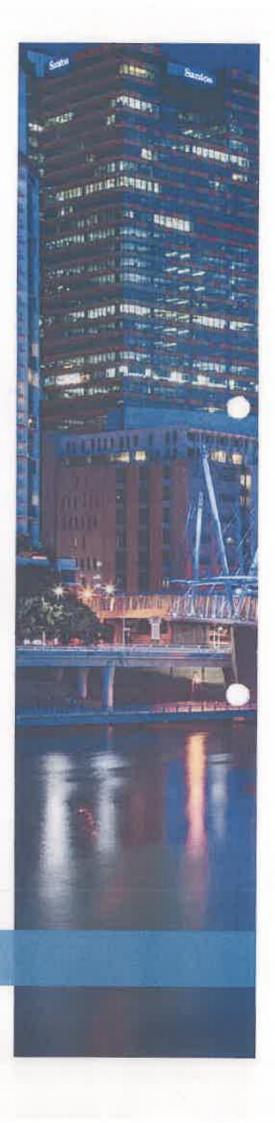
